Archdiocese Database Information Update

The Archdiocese maintains a database of information on all clergy. They have asked for our help in verifying and updating the information for the diaconate community. Members of the Diaconate Community (Deacons & wives, and Widows of Deacons) should have received a letter from me requesting your review, update, and return of the information that the

Archdiocese has in their database. This updated and verified information will be used to help with communication. Please do complete the form and return it in the self-addressed stamped envelope. I will submit the information to the Records department. Your returned form will become part of your file maintained by Records.

To give you a quick view into the current state of the information here are a few datapoints:

164 Deacons and 60 widows will receive letters.

Deacon information

- 98% have email addresses
- 71% have a phone number listed
- 47% of the spouses have an email on file
- 46% of the spouses have a phone number on file
- 3% of included their date of Marriage in the file

Widow information

- 67% have an email address
- 82% have a phone number on file

And this year we are doing something new with the new ordinands – for those 6 months they will be assigned to their home parishes and after their formation is complete, they will receive their permanent assignments from Archbishop Hebda. This gives them time during these last busy 6 months of formation to at least have the comfort of their home parish while they are getting use to the freshness of their new ordained ministry as a deacon. Please, pray for these men as they begin their lives as deacons within this great church of ours. While they have the wonderful graces of ordination – prayers always enhance any graces God blesses us with!!

Also – in spite of a long winter, an even longer Covid season – we are going to try to get back to some semblance of normalcy in the year of 2022 starting with our Deacon Council meetings for the year. By that I mean we will be having in person meetings – but they will also be accessible via remote Zoom meetings as well. I think we all need opportunities to be in person when we feel comfortable with that. And these meetings used to be not only great at communicating what is going on within the diaconate but personal interactions with our brother deacons before Covid interrupted all that. I want to start to bring that back to our Deacon Council meetings so they will all be at the Archdiocesan Catholic Center (ACC - or chancery) this year but also available online via Zoom. The schedule is posted elsewhere within this newsletter so look for that as well as those ordination pictures.

Lastly we are working in coordination with the IOCF, Deacon Dan Gannon and the Archbishop to have an assembly of the diaconate this summer. We have a date with the Archbishop and are still working out the details of the location and duration. But we have done this before a number of years ago out at St. Peter in Mendota when the Archbishop was new to all of us. The Archbishop and the leadership team of the diaconate felt it would be good to do that again as we come out of our Covid hibernation!! There are many

Serra Jane Lyons

Serra International is a worldwide apostolate formally recognized by the Vatican for promoting vocations. Its objectives are to promote and foster vocations to Priesthood and Consecrated Religious Life and to support those vocations. It also assists members to recognize and respond in their own lives to God's call to holiness. St Pope John Paul II called Serra the "lay vocation arm of the church."

Serra began in Seattle in 1935 from a group of businessmen who wanted to better live out Christian values in their lives. They named the club after St Junipero Serra who



founded nine missions in California and converted thousands to our Catholic faith. It has grown to almost 20,000 members on six continents.

Serrans value their work and the sense of community they receive by working together for vocations.

The Twin Cities area currently has seven clubs that do a wide variety of services and prayer activities. All the Catholic elementary schools now have the "Traveling Crucifix Program" which serves to get students praying for vocations at an early age. They endeavor to help parish vocation committees promote Priesthood Sunday, Vocation Awareness Week, World Day for Consecrated Life and World Day of Prayer for Vocations. They serve at Ordinations and have started a picnic for seminarians and their families so they get to know each other. Serra has also had a summer Steak Fry for local priests and deacons and their wives. There is an ongoing Adopt a Seminarian Program, Discernment retreat and an annual retreat.

A typical meeting combines Mass and/or a Rosary, breakfast, lunch or dinner, a speaker and time for promoting activities. Many clubs have their own unique programs.

Deacons are welcome to join Serra, in fact there is a "no dues" policy for them! The Serra International convention was held in Chicago in October 2021.






Widows Day Mass & Lunch




