- How can our parish community support parents as they strive to help their children know and love Jesus? (Note: Topic 5B addresses what our parents or schools can do to help the young know and love Jesus.)

IDEAS FOR CONSIDERATION

These ideas are provided to help you get started in your discussion and to provide a framework to give feedback.

- A) Parents as Primary Educators: Equip parents with age-appropriate resources to fulfill their responsibility as primary educators of their children in the faith.
- B) **Build a Catholic Identity and Culture in the Home:** Help parents intentionally live the faith, integrating it into daily life and relationships.
- C) Modeling and Experiencing Daily Prayer in the Family: Encourage parents to pray individually, together as a couple, and with their children.
- D) Faith & Culture: Help parents connect the faith with our current culture (e.g., sanctity of life, sexuality, addictions, media).
- E) Important Life Decisions: Support parents as they help their children navigate important life decisions (e.g., vocation, career, relationships).
- F) Parenting Groups: Offer groups for parents focused on their faith life and passing on the faith to their children.
- G) Engage Families in Parish Life: Draw families into parish life, making the parish their spiritual home.
- H) Accessibility: Make Mass and faith formation accessible and welcoming to all families, including those with active children or special circumstances.
- I) Leaving the Home: Help parents prepare their teens for continuing in the faith after they leave the home (for college or otherwise).
